

CCTV Privacy Notice

Video Surveillance at the Property

This notice provides information about the use of video surveillance (CCTV) at the property and explains how personal data is processed in connection with such surveillance, in accordance with the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR).

1. Data Controller

INNA Danmark is the sole data controller for the video surveillance (CCTV) carried out at the property.

Although INNA Danmark and the owner of the property act as joint data controllers for certain other processing activities related to the administration of the property, the parties have agreed that INNA Danmark alone is responsible for the processing of personal data through CCTV, including compliance with the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) in this regard.

INNA Danmark acts as the contact point for questions relating to video surveillance and the exercise of data subject rights.

2. Purpose of the video surveillance

CCTV is used exclusively for the following purposes:

- to ensure the safety of residents, visitors, and staff,
- to prevent and detect criminal activity (e.g. vandalism, theft, burglary), and
- to protect the property and common areas.

Video surveillance is not used for the purpose of monitoring residents' behaviour or activities beyond what is strictly necessary to achieve the purposes stated above.

3. Areas under surveillance

Video surveillance may take place in **common areas** of the property, such as entrances, exits, parking areas, bicycle rooms, and other shared facilities.

CCTV is **not installed inside private dwellings**.

Clear signage is displayed at the property to inform individuals that video surveillance is in operation.

4. Categories of personal data

The following personal data may be processed through CCTV:

- video recordings of individuals present in the surveilled areas, and
- date and time of recordings.

Audio recording is **not** carried out.

5. Legal basis

The legal basis for the processing of personal data through CCTV is Article 6(1)(f) of the GDPR (legitimate interests).

The legitimate interest pursued is the protection of persons, property, and assets. The surveillance is assessed as necessary and proportionate in relation to these interests.

6. Access to and disclosure of recordings

Access to CCTV recordings is restricted to authorised persons only and solely on a need-to-know basis.

Recordings may be disclosed to third parties, such as the police or insurance companies, **only where required by law or where necessary in connection with the investigation of specific incidents.**

7. Retention period

CCTV recordings are stored for a limited period and are generally deleted after **30 days**, unless recordings are required for the investigation of a specific incident or legal claim, in which case they may be retained for a longer period until the matter has been concluded.

8. Your rights

You have the following rights under the GDPR in relation to the processing of your personal data:

- the right to access your personal data,
- the right to rectification,
- the right to erasure (subject to legal limitations),
- the right to restriction of processing,
- the right to object to processing.

Please note that the right of access may be limited where it would adversely affect the rights and freedoms of others.
